## New Inter-library Loan Service:

The library is now part of the Michigan eLibrary! You can request books from other libraries in the state all with your Fowlerville library card. Follow these steps to request a book:

1. Go to [www.fowlervillelibrary.org](http://www.fowlervillelibrary.org) and click "Card Catalog." Search for a book title in our system first.
2. If you can't find the book you need from our library, then click the **MeLCat icon** on the Card Catalog home page or the library's homepage to search other Michigan libraries.
3. When you find the title on the **MeLCat catalog**, click on **Get This For Me!**
4. Select **Fowlerville District Library** from the drop down menu. Enter your name and library card number.
5. You will then be notified when your book arrives.

We'll "Make a Splash" by reading books, singing songs, and doing tons of different activities. Sign-up starts May 17 to attend weekly events:

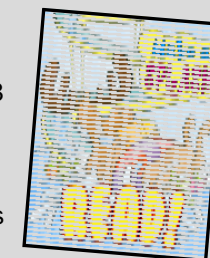
